Course Topics: Vector functions, electrostatics, surface integrals, the divergence, line integrals, the curl, the gradient, suffix notation and tensors.

Homework: I will regularly assign homework. It will not be graded, but doing it is required for learning the course material.

Quizzes: There will be a quiz on the Friday of most weeks. This will be short, and taken at the beginning of class.

Exams: There will be two unit tests during the semester and a 2-hr final exam, scheduled for Wednesday of final exam week (Dec. 11) at 12:30–2:30 PM. Roughly half of the final exam will cover material since the last unit test, and the other half will cover earlier material (i.e., it will be cumulative).

Grading: The final grade is based 20% from each of the unit tests, 20% from the quiz average, and 40% from the final exam. The final letter grade is determined according to the following scale:

Attendance/Makeup Policy: I will not take attendance. If you miss a class, you are still responsible for learning the material that you missed, and for doing the assigned homework. If you miss a test or quiz because of an unexcused absence, you will receive a 0 on that test or quiz. If you miss a test or quiz because of an excused absence, I will use your score on the final exam as your score on that test or quiz.
